

Announcement of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) Subject: Order of Temporary Closure of Premises (No. 5)

According to the Announcement of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) on Order of Temporary Closure of Premises (No. 4) dated 27th March 2020 with the approval of the BMA Committee on the Communicable Diseases' Meeting Resolution No. 6/2563 dated 27th March 2020 to reduce the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), considered to be a dangerous contagious disease, and to limit public gatherings and meetings in public and private settings to prevent widespread contagion; however, with an increasing number of confirmed cases, it is necessary to have additional premises temporarily closed.

By the virtue of Section 35(1) of the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2015), and regulations issued under provisions of Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situation B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1) dated 25th March 2020, Governor of Bangkok, with the approval of the BMA Committee on the Communicable Diseases' Meeting Resolution No. 7/2563 dated 1st April 2020, there shall have the following order:

- 1. Clause 1 of Announcement of the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration on Order of Temporary Closure of Premises (No. 4) dated 27th March 2020 shall be revoked;
- 2. Following premises shall be temporarily <u>closed</u> between 2nd April 2020 and 30th April 2563;
- 2.1 Restaurants or those selling beverage, restaurants or those selling beverage located in commercial buildings, and food or beverage stalls and hawkers (allowed to be opened between 05.01 hrs. and 24.00 hrs. only for delivery and takeaway food or beverage to be eaten off the premises and restaurants or those selling beverage in the hotels are available only for the hotel guests or for delivery and takeaway food or beverage to be eaten off the premises; except the restaurants and food and beverage courts at airports and canteens at hospitals, seats for eating can be arranged);
- 2.2 Convenience stores, supermarkets and those similar to convenience stores shall be <u>closed</u> between 00.01 hrs. and 05.00 hrs;
 - 2.3 All state and private public parks.

All these exempt places according to this Announcement or any other places apart from this Announcement, relating persons shall comply with the disease prevention measures prescribed by the Government and with Clause 11 of Regulation Issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situation B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1) dated 25th March 2020.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with this Order shall be guilty of an offense under Section 52 of the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2015) which shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand (100,000) Baht or to both and shall be guilty of an offense under Section 18 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situation B.E. 2548 (2005) which shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding forty thousand (40,000) Baht or to both.

As this is a case where there is urgent necessity and the delay of action may cause great harm to any individual or affect the public interest, litigants shall not be given the right to object under Section 30 paragraph two (1) of the Administrative Procedure Act, B.E. 2539 (1996).

This Order shall take effect on 2nd April 2020 onwards.
